

## Winter Bird Feeding: Lab 3

Information to put in (you decide how to best organize the information).

Make sure you follow the 7x7 rule:

Winter storms in cold climates can affect wild birds. Ice and deep snow reduce the natural food supply, and birds, consequently, have a difficult time surviving and thriving. People can help the birds by buying or making feeders, hanging them in the backyard, and keeping them clean and full. Nutritious winter seed foods include mixes of black oil sunflowers, hulled peanuts, and white millet. Suet and peanut butter are high-energy foods that help the birds stay warm. Providing water also helps the birds from becoming dehydrated. Place the feeders at least 10 feet from shrubs and compact the snow beneath them.
